

Flowers: Holly and Narcissus

**Holly** is best known as an evergreen shrub with red berries that appear later in the growing season. Its branches have long been used in holiday decorations like wreaths and centerpieces.

Narcissus (paperwhite) is a bulb best grown indoors that blooms beautiful white flowers.









Flowers: Snowdrop and Carnation

The earliest garden flower to bloom, the **snowdrop** (Galanthus), emerges in late winter or early spring, sometimes when snow is still on the ground.

**Carnations** are intolerant of high heat and might be a poor choice for a southern garden. They bloom in midsummer, preferring bright sun, but can also bloom in temperatures just above freezing.

I cannot believe how blessed I am to share another Christmas season with you. Last Sunday, I was excited to see the members filling the sanctuary, singing, and decorating for the coming of our Lord Jesus. The decorating inspired me to bake my favorite

Pillsbury Christmas cookies for a pre-Christmas treat. I want Christmas to be essential for everyone. I often need to remind myself that Christmas is different for everyone. So, I spent some time in prayer today, thinking about my message for this year's letter.

I want you to know, Christmas is about the birth of Jesus and his return. Christmas is not about spending money or giving gifts, though nothing is wrong with doing those things. Next, Christmas is a time to seek Peace and not dwell on the past. Last, Christmas is an opportunity to be a blessing, not a burden. I'm sure you have heard most of these things before; however, give yourself time to let this sink in and to pray.

I have listened to many of my contemporaries suggest that there is a war on Christmas. I, for one, do not believe that. However, what I think is an effort to reduce or even eliminate Jesus from Christmas. Because of this, I am concerned that we are missing the Joy of getting to know Jesus at Christmas. I have discovered some startling statistics to support what I suspect and have seen. Approximately 65% of Americans profess to be Christians; however, only 18% regularly attend a church. What is also disturbing is that about 89% of Americans celebrate the Christmas Holiday, which means that most Americans who celebrate Christmas do not set foot in a Church. I am not telling you this to discourage you. I tell you this because the harvest is ready, and we have an excellent opportunity to celebrate and prepare for Christmas.
